He was born and raised in England, went to college at Oxford University, then studied for the Ph.D. at the University of California, Berkeley. He has been on the Emory faculty since 1988 and is the author of six books, including *I'm the Teacher, You're the Student: A Semester in the University Classroom*. He is also one of the "Great Teachers" and has made five lecture series with The Teaching Company, most recently on the Rise and Fall of the British Empire. He has lectured extensively in Europe and America, and traveled widely as a study guide with groups of Emory alumni (most recently in southern Africa), and on trans-Atlantic ocean crossings with Cunard and Silverseas. He will lecture on the history of Egypt in the nineteenth and twentieth centuries.

**Day 1 - March 8th - Sunday****USA / Cairo**

Depart on a regularly scheduled flight to Cairo, Egypt.

**Day 2 - March 9th - Monday****Cairo**

Arrival at Cairo Airport and transfer to hotel.

**Day 3 - March 10th - Tuesday (B, L)****Cairo**

After breakfast, explore the world-famous Egypt Museum of Antiquities. With its relics dating back to 4,000 B.C., this museum experience will provide you with an excellent background in the various periods of Egyptian history. Lunch at a local restaurant. Visit some of Cairo's finest mosques (Muhammed Ali and Sultan Hassan), the Medieval Citadel of Salah El Din, and the colorful bazaars of Khan El Khalili. The narrow picturesque lanes are lined with items such as copperware, gold and silver, jewelry, gems, spices, and silks.

**Day 4 - March 11th - Wednesday (B, L)****Cairo / Memphis / Sakkara**

Breakfast at your hotel. Enjoy a pleasant drive across typical Egyptian countryside to Memphis, the capital of the old Kingdom of Egypt. Stop at the colossal statue of Ramses II, then proceed to the Necropolis Sakkara to visit the world's first great stone structure, the Step Pyramid of King Zoser. A late lunch will be provided and the afternoon will be at leisure.

**Day 5 - March 12th - Thursday (B, L, D)****Cairo / Abu Simbel / Aswan**

After breakfast, transfer to Cairo airport for your flight to Abu Simbel. Visit the famous rock temples of Abu Simbel, built 3,500 years ago by Ramses II, which rank among the most colossal monuments of Ancient Egypt. Both temples at Abu Simbel, weighing more than 40,000 tons, were moved 90 feet higher to prevent them from being inundated when the Aswan High Dam created Lake Nassar. Fly back to Aswan and transfer to your hotel.

**Day 6 - March 13th - Friday (B, L, D)****Aswan**

Visit the High Dam, the Granite Quarries and Unfinished Obelisk, and the Temple of Philae. Check in to your cruise ship. Afternoon is at leisure. Sail on the Nile in a felucca to visit the Botanical Gardens and to view the Aga Kahn Mausoleum.

**Day 7- March 14th - Saturday (B, L, D)****Aswan / Kom Ombo / Edfu**

Sail to Kom Ombo. Arrive at Kom Ombo, where you will visit the Temple of the crocodile-headed god Sobek and the falcon-headed god Horus. Continue sail to Edfu and observe the farm and village life of the people along the riverbanks.

**Day 8 - March 15th - Sunday (B, L, D)****Edfu / Luxor**

In the morning you will visit Edfu Temple, one of the Egypt's best-preserved temples dedicated to Horus, the god of sun and planets. The falcon is a prominent decoration. It is one of the last Ptolemaic temples, finished only a few decades before the rise of Anthony and Cleopatra. Continue your sail to Luxor.

**Day 9 - March 16th - Monday (B, L, D)****Luxor**

Disembarkation after breakfast. In the morning you will cross the Nile to the west bank to visit the Necropolis of Thebes, burial ground of the great pharaohs. Visit the Colossi of Memnon, the twin statues of Amenhotep III; the Valley of the Nobles; the Temple of Queen Hatshepsut, one of the most handsome monuments in Egypt; and the fabulous Valley of the Kings, including the tomb of King Tutankhamun. Check in to your hotel. Afternoon at leisure for shopping or relax on the ship.

**Day 10 - March 17th - Tuesday (B, L, D)****Luxor - Denderah**

This full-day program will start with a visit to the Temple of Denderah, constructed during the time of the Roman emperors. In front are six dramatic columns with capitals in the shape of the cow-headed goddess, Hathor. Reliefs on the walls show the empress Cleopatra, and there are sculptures of the gnomelike, Bes. Return from

Denderah. After lunch you may wish to pay a visit to the new Luxor Museum on your own. In the evening attend the Sound and Light Show at Karnak Temple.

### **Day 11 - March 18th - Wednesday (B)**

#### **Luxor / Cairo**

Take a tour of two of Egypt's finest temples, the Temples of Luxor and Karnak. The Temple of Luxor was built by Amenophis III and extended by Ramses II. Travel along the Sharia El Bahr to Karnak Temple with its Hypostyle hall covering 50,000 square feet and containing 134 columns that once supported an enormous roof. Transfer to Luxor airport and fly back to Cairo and transfer to your hotel.

### **Day 12 - March 19th - Thursday (B, D)**

#### **Cairo**

Visit the famous pyramids of the pharaohs at Giza and the mysterious guardian, the Sphinx. You will also view one of the greatest finds in the history of Egyptology - the 142-foot Solar Boat of the Pharaoh Cheops, nearly 4,600 years old. Afternoon will be at leisure. Special farewell dinner is planned for the evening.

# TERMS AND CONDITIONS

## RESERVATIONS & DEPOSITS

Early reservations are essential. A deposit of \$500.00 per person is required at the time of registration. Balance is due 60 days prior to departure with an additional deposit due 90 days prior to departure. All pricing is in \$US dollars.

## SINGLE TRAVELERS

Accommodations are based on double occupancy. Single accommodations are sometimes difficult to obtain but should a request be made, TraveLearn, Inc. will do its best to secure these accommodations.

## AIR FARE / FLIGHT ITINERARY

We can assist you with getting airfare. There is a \$50 per person air ticket fee for this service. Tickets are express mailed to you with your final documents approximately two weeks prior to your departure.

## BAGGAGE

Airline baggage restrictions vary greatly from airline to airline. The most common, on regularly scheduled flights to and from the U.S. is two checked piece, the total dimensions (Width+Height+Length) of which do not exceed 107 inches provided neither piece exceeds 62 inches. One unchecked piece of carry-on luggage, the total dimensions of which do not exceed 45 inches. Please note that some destinations have not approved the piece count rules, and the international weight rule of a maximum of 44 lbs. still applies.

## ELIGIBILITY / HEALTH

Information on health requirements for this program will be mailed to you upon registration. We recommend that all travelers check with their personal physician about medications and inoculations. Any physical condition requiring special attention, diet, or treatment must be reported in writing when the reservation is made. By forwarding a signed registration form and trip deposit, you certify that you do not knowingly have any physical or other conditions of disability that would create a risk for you or other trip participants. We assume no responsibility for medical care or for special dietary requirements. Hospital facilities for serious problems are often unavailable and evacuation can be prolonged, difficult, and expensive. A parent or guardian for the entire journey must accompany individuals under the age of 18. There is no maximum age limit, but all participants must be in good health and physically fit. The Educational Institution and TraveLearn, Inc. reserves the right to decline to accept any person as a member of a program or to require any participant to withdraw from a program at any time when such action is determined to be in the best interests of the health, safety, and general welfare of the group or individual.

## NOT INCLUDED IN TOUR COST

Cost of obtaining passport or visa; expenses on the U.S. mainland; personal expenses such as beverages; laundry; phone calls; faxes; cables; travel insurance; excess baggage fees; items not on regular menus; expenses of guides, buses, or cars for sightseeing not included in the itinerary; gratuities to guides; airport taxes and other items not mentioned as being included. Transfers to / from the airport unless schedule is sent to TraveLearn.

## CANCELLATION / INSURANCE
